ST. JOHN'S CHURCH

MANY OF THE OLD CENTRALS PUPILS WERE PLAYING CRICKET TOGETHER FOR THIS CHURCH SIDE IN 1889, WHEN THE FOOTBALL TEAM WAS FIRST MOOTED





WIMBLEDON COMMON

AS WIMBLEDON OLD CENTRALS, THE CLUB FIRST PLAYED ON A PITCH BY ROBIN HOOD ROAD AND ANOTHER NEAR WEST PLACE AND THE POUND





FOX & GRAPES PUBLIC HOUSE

THE CLUB'S FIRST CHANGING ROOMS AND GOALPOST STORAGE FROM 1895. THEY WERE ROBBED BY 'A PROWLER OF THE THIEVING TYPE' DURING A HERALD CUP GAME ON 3 DECEMBER 1892





RIDGWAY COFFEE TAVERN

VENUE OF THE FIRST OLD CENTRALS END-OF-SEASON GENERAL MEETING ON 26TH APRIL 1890, CHAIRED BY TEAM CAPTAIN GEORGE RAYMENT





THE SWAN PUBLIC HOUSE

HQ AND CHANGING ROOMS FOR MATCHES ON THE COMMON BETWEEN 1895-1905, DURING WHICH TIME THE CLUB WON A TREBLE AND CHANGED COLOURS FROM BROWN AND BLUE TO GREEN AND BLACK





THE SULTAN PUBLIC HOUSE

THIS SITE WAS USED AS A CHANGING ROOM FOR WIMBLEDON FC IN 1894-1895, WHENTHEY PLAYED HOME GAMES AT HAYDONS ROAD REC





WELCOME COFFEE ROOM

THE VENUE FOR THE SECOND GENERAL WIMBLEDON FC MEETING WHERE A SHOW OF HANDS FROM NINE TEAM MEMBERS CHANGED A CONTROVERSIAL 1-0 DEFEAT BY KINGSTON WANDERERS, TO A 1-1 DRAW





WORPLE ROAD WEST

THE CLUB'S FIRST "PROPER AND ENCLOSED" GROUND FROM 1901-1906 WAS CLOSE BY. INITIALLY ATTRACTING JUST 35 SEASON TICKET HOLDERS. WHILST HERE, THEY CHANGED NAME TO WIMBLEDON FC IN 1905





COTTENHAM PARK SCHOOL

DRESSING ROOMS FOR THE WORPLE ROAD WEST AND PEPYS ROAD GROUNDS WERE SITED HERE. THE SCHOOL WAS DEMOLISHED IN 1975





PEPYS ROAD

AFTER FIVE YEARS AT WORPLE ROAD WEST, WIMBLEDON FC NOW PLAYED SENIOR FOOTBALL. HOME FOR SEASONS 1906-07 AND 1907-08 WAS A GROUND AT THE BOTTOM OF THE HILL





GRAND DRIVE

FOR THE FIRST HALF OF 1908 WIMBLEDON FC WERE STILL SEARCHING FOR ROOTS TO PUT DOWN AND PLAYED ON THE OTHER SIDE OF THE RAILWAY TRACKS, WITH AN ENTRANCE NEAR THE STATION





THE CHASE, MERTON HALL ROAD

THE 1908-09 SEASON WAS SPENT AT A LARGE AND ESTABLISHED AREA OF PLAYING FIELDS TO THE SOUTH OF THE CHASE (THIS FOOTPATH BETWEEN MERTON HALL ROAD AND RAYNES PARK)





BURLINGTON ROAD (BLAGDON ROAD)

CHOSEN IN 1909 FOR ITS EASE OF ACCESS AND IN HOPE OF INCREASING ATTENDANCES, IT DREW CROWDS IN EXCESS OF 1000 BUT WAS PRONE TO FLOODING AND ONLY STAGED FIVE GAMES. NOW PARTLY PARK





NORBITON PARKHOTEL

DESPITE A CRICKET PAVILLION ON THE BLAGDON ROAD GROUND, WIMBLEDON FC CHANGED IN THE NEARBY PUBLIC HOUSE





MALDEN WANDERERS CRICKET CLUB

WHEN THEIR PREVIOUS GROUND PROVED UNUSABLE, WIMBLEDON FC USED A PITCH AT MALDEN WANDERERS CRICKET CLUB FOR THE REMAINDER OF THEIR 1909-1910 SEASON





THE ROYAL OAK PUBLIC HOUSE

USED AS THE WIMBLEDON FC CHANGING ROOMS
AND HOSTED MEETINGS WHILST THE TEAM PLAYED
AT MALDEN WANDERERS CRICKET CLUB





THE ALEXANDRA HOTEL & PUBLIC HOUSE

THE ALEXANDRA HOTEL AND PUBLIC HOUSE WAS USED AS WIMBLEDON FC'S HEADQUARTERS DURING THEIR 1905-06 AND 1909-10 SEASONS





DUNDONALD ROAD RECREATION GROUND

THE HOME GROUND OF WIMBLEDON ST. ANDREWS FC WHO JOINED WITH CORPORATION EMPLOYEES FC TO FORM WIMBLEDON BOROUGH FC IN 1911





HAYDONS ROAD RECREATION GROUND

WIMBLEDON FC PLAYED HOME GAMES HERE DURING THEIR 1894-1895 SEASON. IT WAS ALSO THE ORIGINAL HOME GROUND OF THE WIMBLEDON FC LADIES





FIELD'S FARM

THE HOME GROUND OF CORPORATION EMPLOYEES FC
BEFORE THEY MOVED TO COPPERMILL LANE IN 1910
AND THEN JOINED WITH WIMBLEDON ST. ANDREWS FC
TO FORM WIMBLEDON BOROUGH FC IN 1911





COPPERMILL LANE

PARTLY ON THE SITE OF AFC WIMBLEDON'S STADIUM, COUNCIL-BACKED WIMBLEDON BOROUGH FC PLAYED THE 1911-12 SEASON AT THE TOWN GROUND HERE, BEFORE MERGING WITH WIMBLEDON FC





ST. ANDREWS CHURCH

ST. ANDREWS CHURCH IS THE ORIGINAL BASE USED FOR WIMBLEDON ST. ANDREWS FC, WHO WENT ON TO BECOME THE FAMOUS WIMBLEDON FC





PIOUGH LANE

A REFUSE DUMP WAS PURCHASED LEASEHOLD FROM THE LOCAL COUNCIL AND THE SITE BECAME WIMBLEDON FOOTBALL CLUB'S MUCH-LOVED (AND MUCH-MISSED) HOME FROM 1912 TO 1991





RICHARDSON EVANS

NOW A MULTI-SPORTS FACILITY, IT WAS A TRAINING GROUND FOR WIMBLEDON FC FOR MANY YEARS AND OFTEN THE EPICENTRE OF THE INFAMOUS 'CRAZY GANG' PHENOMENA

THE VENUE FOR TWO CRUCIAL PUBLIC MEETINGS
