Wimbledon in Sporting History (WiSH) proudly presents Wimbledon's first ever sporting audio visual exhibition @ Wimbledon Quarter from 28 June to 13 July 2025.



You'll be able to view films, pictures, artwork, trophies, medals, badges, shirts, programmes, press cuttings, books, bikes, boots, balls and much more.

There'll be guest appearances across the whole run and special visits from different Wombles as well.

In addition we'll be running an art competition for all ages at Wimbledon Library. At the old stadium, over 50 years ago, we had the Sportsman sign. We'd like you to re-imagine it as if it was being created today, recognising the many cultural changes that have happened over those five decades, women, disabilities, sport for all and everyone.

We're challenging you to create a new Sportsman sign we can use, there'll also be a gift or two for the most creative entries, it can be original art, it could be computer graphic generated – be creative and give us a new sign to use.

WiSH is an award winning multi-sports Heritage Charity, running a Museum at the Cherry Red Records Stadium in Plough Lane, the home of AFC Wimbledon.

Supported by 52 dedicated volunteers, WiSH run Stadium Tours, make films, publish books, install sporting installations (from recycled materials), support the Wimbledon Old Players Association (WOPA) develop heritage trails across the borough and have even staged a play.

All of this is brought to you with free entrance in partnership with the Dons Den, Wimbledon Quarter, Love Wimbledon, Dons Local Action, Merton Heritage, Digital Works, The ARK, Microform Digital and AFC Wimbledon.

Hear and see the "Greatest Story in Sports" detailing how Wimbledon has created and influenced sports locally, nationally and internationally since the 1800s.

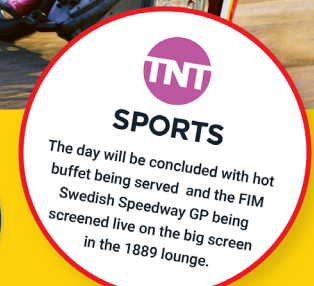

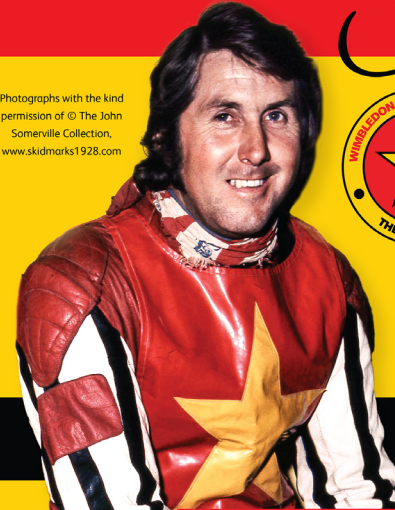
