Our judges had difficulty choosing winners, but we can now reveal them to you.

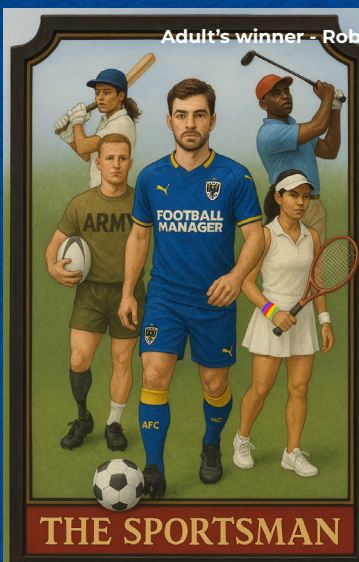
